

REPUBLICANS NOT GIVING UP ON PRESIDENT TRUMP

A December poll of 500 registered Republicans in Florida's 19th Congressional District reveals that voters' perceptions of the Presidential election have changed very little since November.

All marginal changes in response proportions are within the two polls' combined margins of error, meaning the differences in results are not statistically significant.

Q1: Did voter fraud play a role in Joe Biden's projected victory?

Q3: Would you support the Florida state legislature pursuing acts of secession from the United States if a Biden/Harris Presidency is otherwise unavoidable?

- Peaceful Transition: "President Trump should concede the election to Joe Biden and proceed with a peaceful transition of power."
- Pursue All Legal Remedies: "President Trump should pursue any and all legal remedies available to maintain his position as President."
- Undecided: "Undecided."
